

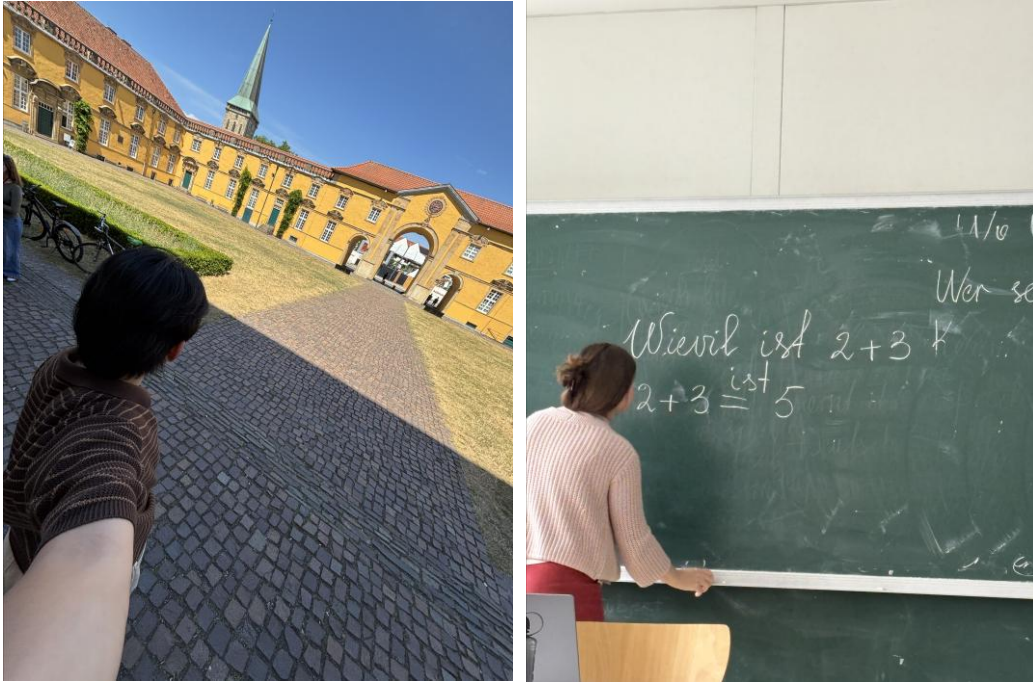
Summer School Return Report

1. Class

The lecture title and the actual class content were slightly different. I thought I would be learning about the German language and culture, but it was conducted entirely as a German language class. So it was a class suitable for people who know nothing at all about German and want to know about language. I was able to learn very basic things such as basic greetings, family introductions, food and cooking, homes and furniture, and hobbies. Each class consists of about 10 to 12 students, and because the students take turns presenting, they can develop their pronunciation and speaking skills. There were a total of two assignments, and the first was a writing assignment introducing myself, my family, and my friends. Second, I had to film and edit videos of the room and kitchen where I currently lived, as well as making my favorite dishes. And the schedule was quite tight, so it wasn't easy to keep up without focusing on my studies. Overall, I was satisfied with the lesson content and what I gained

afterwar. But compared to the B1 level English proficiency required, the class was conducted in German (the professor used only German), so I had to infer what the professor was saying and study on my own, which was challenging.
