

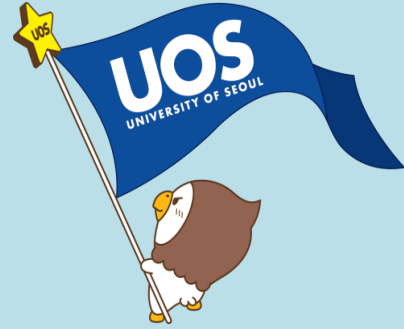

Gyeongbokgung Palace is the largest and most magnificent of Korea's five royal palaces, originally built in 1395 during the Joseon Dynasty. It served as **the main royal palace** and **remains one of Korea's most important historical and cultural landmarks**. Visitors can admire its beautiful traditional architecture, spacious gardens, and the picturesque backdrop of Bugaksan Mountain. **Explore the heart of Korea's royal heritage and experience the beauty of Korean history.**

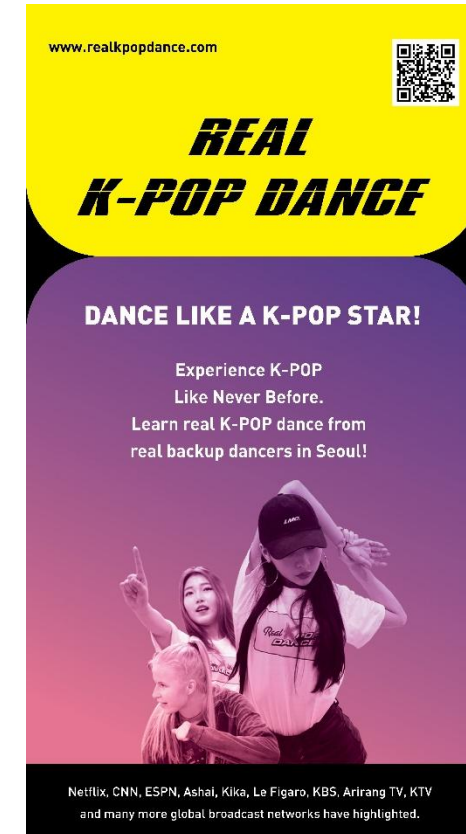


Each participant will make a personal stone seal and learn the art of Jeongak (Seal Engraving) to carve their own Korean name seal.

Jeongak is the traditional art of carving characters or designs onto a seal. The term originates from the practice of engraving Chinese seal script (Jeonseo) onto stone, wood, or other materials to create personal stamps and artistic seals.

- If you check in after office hours, you **must visit the Dormitory Office the next day** to complete your check-in.



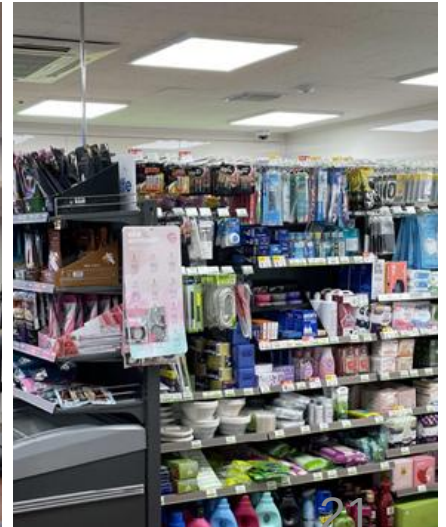
- There is a toilet/shower inside the house, and it is shared with your housemates.

Dormitory Information:

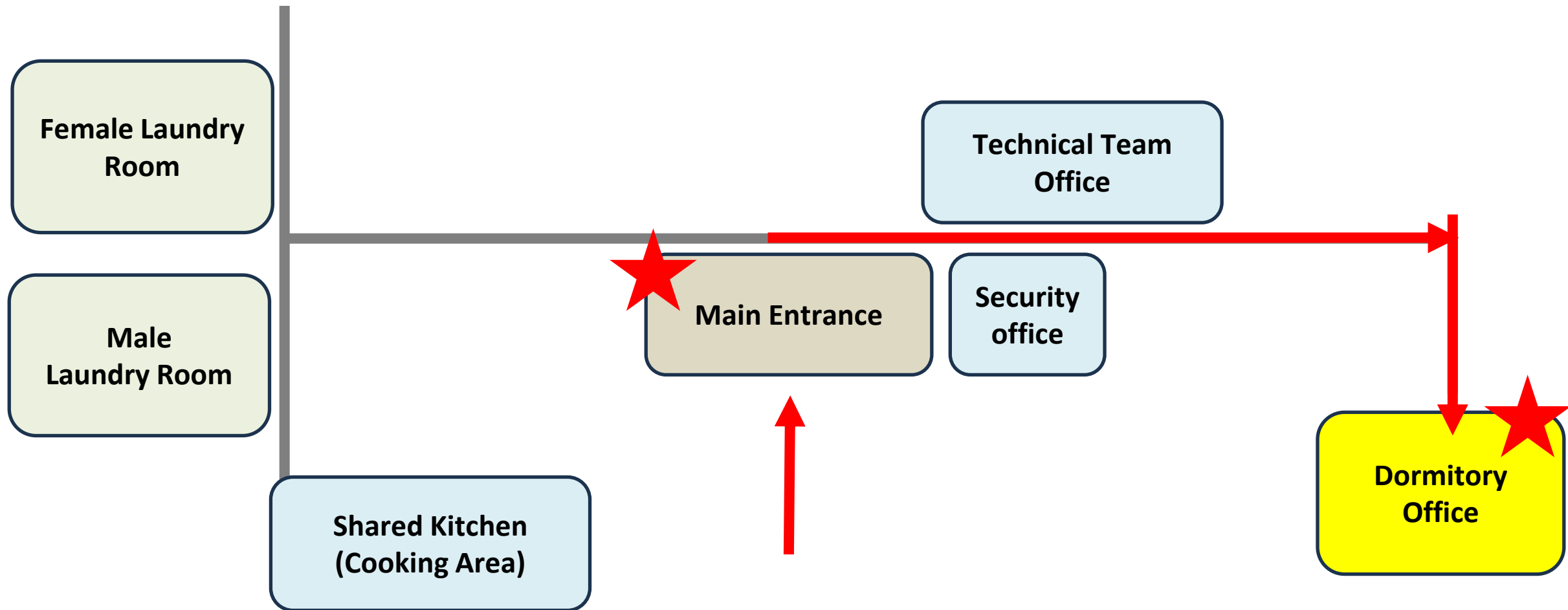
How to Check-In (Dormitory Office)

1. Visit the Dormitory Office

When you enter the dormitory building, turn right and go straight. At the end of the hallway, turn right again. You will see the dormitory office.

2. Register Your Fingerprint at the Dormitory Office

3. Pick up your Bedding (For students who applied for bedding service)

How to Enter your Room

- Each house has a door lock (press the password) and each room needs a key to open.
- You can get a room key and a door lock password when you move-in.
- If you lose your key, you need to pay 5,000 won for reissuing a new key.
